Who's Interview?

Interviews work two ways

You're interviewing the company as well

 How they conduct the interview reflects how they operate as a business

Who's Interview?

- Would you be happy working with the people interviewing you?
- You can get a good feel for the vibe and culture, stress levels

• Is this the right company for you?

What are they 100king for?

- You need **both** of the following to succeed:
 - Soft skills
 - What do you do when not in front of a computer hobbies, cool stuff, relaxation
 - Can you communicate effectively to non-tech as well as peers
 - Team-working
 - Professional
 - Team and culture fit
 - **Technical aptitude** you got this

Do you have any questions?

- They expect you to ask questions
- Make sure you have questions prepared e.g.
 - What does the team do outside the office?
 - How do others progress in their career?
 - What training is available?
 - How will I be supported?
 - How did this role come about?

What do you want?

- Stability
- Competitive salary and benefits
- Training
- Technical challenges
- Fun
- Great team
- Synergy

- Progression
- Support
- Approachable management
- Fulfilment
- Respect
- Meaningful projects
- BINGO

- Know the significant history and hierarchy of the company
- What are their products and services?
- Where are their offices?
- What is their motto and values?
- What do they do differently?

Do the Research

Tips

• Take any past bad experiences you've had, find the positive and reflect upon learnings. Show improvement and willingness to learn.

Let them lead the process so just relax and breathe.

 Don't bring up pay, again let them bring this up but be prepared to discuss it. Aim high but not too high. Be realistic but don't undervalue yourself. There is an art to this.

Tips

• Take the water/tea/coffee if offered. You can sip the beverage to give you a moment to compose your answer if needed.

• Don't bitch about your current job or colleagues, again find the positives. You can discuss the negative aspects in a positive spin.

Just conduct yourself as you would in front of any client.

Technical Interview Tips

• If you don't know the answer to a question simply say so

Be honest and don't blag or lie

Make this an opportunity to learn something if you don't know

Technical Interview Tips

 Get them involved in your thinking process if possible, let them help you work through the problems

This shows you're a team player and not afraid to ask for help

Don't be afraid to get things wrong. Embrace failure -> positive

Preparing for your Interview

- >Get a good night's sleep the evening before
- > Have breakfast
- > Wear the suit, look your best
- > Be positive and remember to smile
- >Relax, they can't eat you
- >Arrive a little early but not too early
 - >Running late? Call them and let them know ASAP!

&& afterwards

- Be sure to thank them
- Ask for feedback
- Give feedback (the day after)
- Ask any pressing questions on your mind
- If this is the one, be sure to tell them how important it is to you (the day after)

There's always another opportunity

All interviews are experiences

• It could be that the fit just wasn't right and it's not you, it's them

Learn and improve for next time

• Move on, don't feel miserable. Don't sweat it

BONOUS: Shit Company Radar

- ☐ They expect you to work for free to prove yourself
- ☐ Prolonged and drawn out interview process
- □Sloppiness of the interviewers lateness, unwelcome vibe
- ☐ Mucky desks / cramped office
- □ Nobody smiling
- ☐ Tense feeling in the office
- ☐ They don't ask questions about you or your hobbies during the interview they don't care. Bums on seats.
